How to Delete an Old Google Site and/or Pages

To delete an old Google site, first log in to your chapter's Gmail account and type in **sites.google.com** in the search bar. This will take you to the area where the old website lives. Next, click on the title for the old website.



Next, select the gear icon in the upper-right corner of the page and click Manage site.



Scroll down the page to the tab that says Delete. Click Delete and follow the prompts when it asks if you are sure you want to delete the website.
