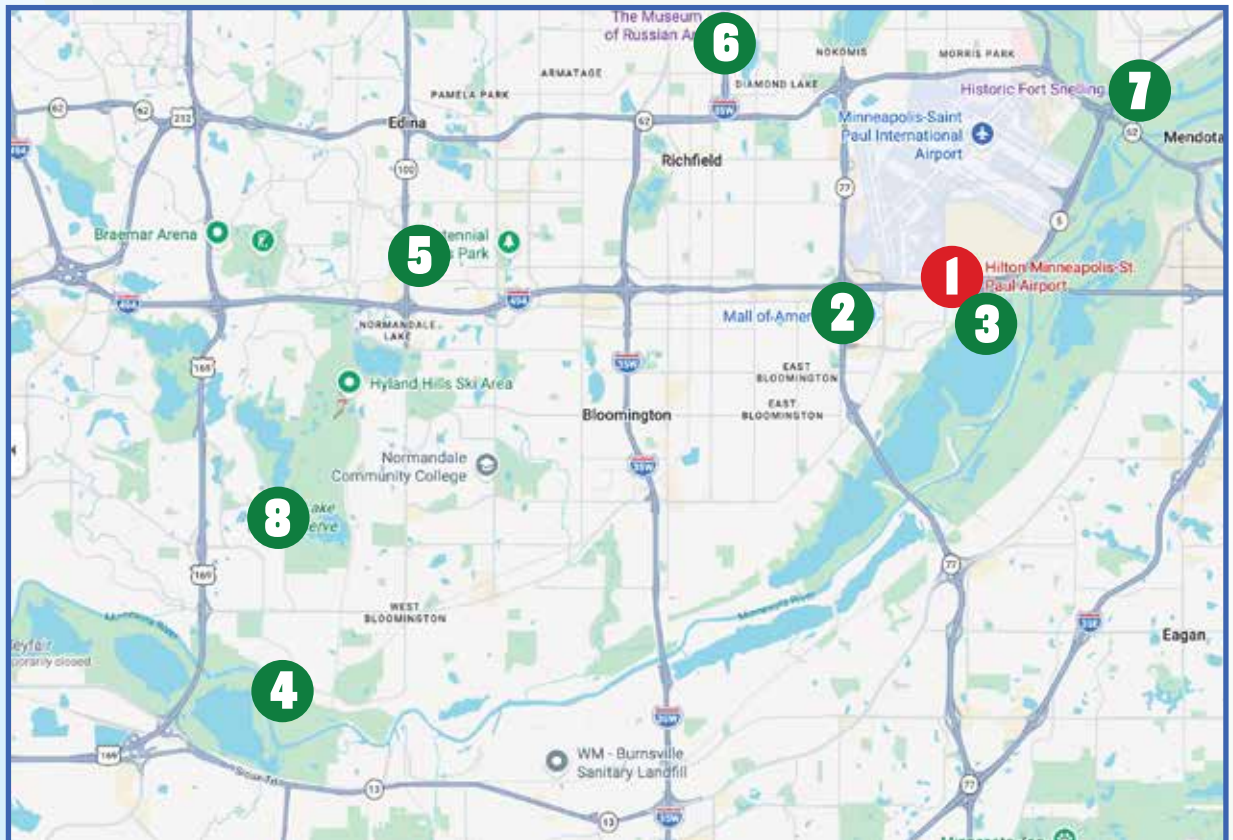

The Speakers



Betty McCollum Minnesota Congresswoman
Representing Minnesota in Congress since 2001, Representative McCollum has been a leading advocate for protecting the Mississippi River, restoring critical habitat, supporting outdoor recreation, and ensuring that future generations inherit healthy natural resources. She has been the driving force behind the Mississippi River Restoration and Resilience Initiative, a landmark effort to bring sustained federal investment to improve water quality, restore habitat, reduce invasive species, and strengthen the resilience of America's greatest river.



Griffith Pugh
Host, The Young IKE Podcast, Vice President, Minnesota Valley Chapter IWLA, 2024 Outdoor America Future Award Recipient
Griffith Pugh is the founder and host of The Young Ike, a podcast and community dialogue project exploring today's complex environmental challenges through conversation. Griffith studies political science at Haverford College. Alongside his academic work, he has built experience in journalism and social entrepreneurship.



Hannah Barisonzi
Founder, Green Crew™
Hannah Barisonzi is a youth conservation leader and co-founder of The Green Crew™, a nationally recognized, youth-led environmental service program based in Minnesota. Through The Green Crew™, she has helped mobilize young people to lead hands-on conservation, scientific research, and community-based environmental initiatives.



Mark Ritchie
Former Minnesota secretary of state
Mark Ritchie was elected Minnesota's secretary of state in the November 2006 general election. He was supported by the Secretary of State Project, a progressive organization formed in response to the 2000 presidential election. In 2008, Ritchie presided over the most publicly scrutinized recount in the history of the United States Senate, the election contest of Al Franken and Norm Coleman. The Minnesota Supreme Court unanimously supported the conclusions of the recount.



Becky Rom
National Chair, Campaign to Save the Boundary Waters
Becky Rom, a retired attorney, has worked in the outdoors for over 30 years and learned at an early age the importance of this wild country. She first worked on wilderness preservation when she was a seventh-grader, engaging in public debates on the merits of the bill that became the Wilderness Act. Becky has worked as a citizen activist on wilderness preservation throughout the United States but she continues to be drawn back home to the Boundary Waters.



Mike Dombeck
Former director of the Bureau of Land Management 14th Chief of the United States Forest Service
Michael Dombeck is a conservationist, educator, scientist, and outdoorsman. He served as director of the Bureau of Land Management from 1994 to 1997 and was the 14th Chief of the United States Forest Service from 1997 to 2001. He also served as UW System Fellow and Professor of Global Conservation at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point from 2001 to 2010. Mike was also the executive director of the David Smith Post-Doctoral Conservation Research Fellowship from 2005 to 2022.



Hal Herring (INVITED)
Award-winning outdoor journalist
Hal Herring is an award-winning journalist and contributing editor at Field and Stream magazine. He has written for publications that range from the Atlantic Monthly and the Economist to Creative Nonfiction and Orion, and specializes in deeply reported, long-form journalism stories and essays. For the past two years, Hal has been the host of the Backcountry Hunters and Anglers Podcast and Blast, with over 70 episodes published so far.



Carmen Fernholz
Founder, Minnesota Institute for Sustainable Agriculture
Carmen and Sally Fernholz who live on their farm near Madison, Minnesota have recently completed the process of transferring ownership of the land to their four children through a legal structured process known as a Family Limited Partnership. They have also turned over the day to day operations to a young family who live nearby. Carmen continues to stay active with collaborative research with the University of Minnesota and mentoring new organic farmers."



Helene Murray
Executive Director, Minnesota Institute for Sustainable Agriculture, University of Minnesota
Helene Murray leads efforts advancing sustainable and resilient agricultural systems. Her work focuses on sustainable food systems, community-engaged research, and connecting farmers, researchers, educators, and nonprofit organizations. Murray also serves on the graduate faculty in Applied Plant Sciences and interdisciplinary sustainability programs at the University of Minnesota. She is widely recognized for her leadership in strengthening long-term agricultural viability through innovation, collaboration, and inclusive engagement.



Tim Busse
Mayor of Bloomington Board Member, Minnesota Valley Chapter IWLA
Mayor of Bloomington and former City Councilmember (2011-2019), Tim Busse is a collaborative leader advancing practical, community-driven sustainability. He has helped guide Bloomington's leadership in the Minnesota GreenStep Cities program, supporting progress in energy efficiency, climate resilience, and conservation. A skilled communicator and consensus builder, he brings together public, private, and community partners to turn environmental priorities into action.

AGES 5-8

THURS-SAT, JULY 16 - 18



Designed specifically for youth ages 5-8, ELF is led by parents who are **certified early childhood educators with training in outdoor education**. Held concurrently with the Youth Convention, ELF offers guided time in nature where children explore insects, learn about trees and plants, and engage in hands-on activities. The program is designed to nurture curiosity, confidence, and a lasting appreciation for the natural world.

AGES 8-18

JULY 13-15, BEFORE THE CONVENTION



The Green Summer Day Camp is a supervised, drop-in daytime program for youth ages 8-18, offered Monday through Wednesday prior to the National Convention. Participants engage in age-appropriate outdoor ethics education, water-quality science, wildlife learning and tracking, and guided conservation projects, supported by trained youth leaders, advisors, and volunteers. The program is designed to be safe, flexible, and enriching—no overnight stay required.

AGES 14-21

WEDNESDAY JULY 15



The **Green Crew™ Summit** is a one-day gathering for current and future youth leaders ages 14-21. This is where leaders learn from one another how to design, launch, and grow a Green Crew™—sharing tools, stories, and strategies from an award-winning, nationally recognized youth conservation and leadership program, while helping lay the groundwork for a growing national movement.

AGES 8-18

THURS- SAT, JULY 16 - 18



The 2026 Youth Convention is a youth-led, two-day experience where youth of all ages explore nature, insects, wildlife, trees, and hands-on science with air, water, and soil. Days are filled with games, experiments, and outdoor discovery, with time each evening to reunite with grown-ups—plus an optional overnight camping experience for those who want to extend the adventure.

2026 Youth Convention

In conjunction with the National Convention, kids of all ages are encouraged to join the 2026 Youth Convention. The 2026 Youth Convention will engage and inspire the next generation of conservation leaders through experiential learning, environmental ethics, and hands-on service. Modeled on the award-winning Green Summer program, this event integrates youth leadership, science, and stewardship into the National Convention week – preparing participants to lead similar programs across the country.

The official Youth Convention runs on Thursday night through Saturday evening. Youth-oriented programming happens the full week, offering optional Add-On Days (Monday–Thursday). Most activities take place on the scenic grounds of the Minnesota Valley Chapter and within the adjacent Bloomington Wildlife Refuge – providing an immersive, hands-on environment for discovery and leadership.



General Participants Ages 8-14

The Youth Convention is intentionally youth-designed, youth-led, and youth-powered – a defining characteristic that sets it apart from other national programs. All aspects of planning and implementation are coordinated by youth and young adults under the age of 25.

Junior Counselor Ages 14-17

JC help to lead programs and activities. Paired with a trained and experience adult counselor, JCs will receive their own remote and online training prior to the convention. This is a great experience for our older youth to continue their participation in the Youth Convention with increased responsibility and opportunities.

Adult Counselor Ages 18+

Adult Counselors will include trained Green Crew™ Counselors, Green Summer Counselors and those with experience in a camp setting. Counselors will be trained and credentialed. They will provide leadership (with the support of a JC) of groups of youth in program, activities and conservation service projects.

Adult Advisor Ages 18+

Formerly Chaperones, adult advisors provide logistic and program support to the Counselors. Adult Advisors will receive orientation prior to the convention, and will be assigned a specific support role. Register as a Volunteer for the Convention.
